

Use the following link to determine poverty for your census tract.

You will arrive at this screen. **Under 'Geography' you will need to select 'Census Tract'.** When you click it you will have access to a list of states. **Choose Virginia and then the County you are located within.** When you select the County, you will get a list of all census tracts available within that jurisdiction. **Select the tract where your property is located and then select the data table 'S1701- Poverty Status in the Past 12 Months.'**
