MORE ABOUT THE PROPERTY

Less than three years after a fire enveloped the tires and trash scattered across an empty lot, this site is now home to a beautiful, five-story apartment building called The Foundry.

The Foundry is part of a huge effort to revitalize Northside's Chamberlayne industrial district into Richmond's newest residential neighborhood. *Chamberbrook* is the newly garnered name for the area where multiple apartment buildings are going up. The name is a portmanteau of the area's two main streets, Chamberlayne Avenue and Brook Road.

Rising from behind I-95, The Foundry provides 200 affordable units in a region with an accelerating housing affordability crisis. All of the units are income-based, including one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments with 10 floor plans to choose from. The property is near Virginia Union University and other employment centers, and has a swimming pool, community clubhouse and playground for residents to enjoy.



Amenities include a community clubhouse.

Thanks to The Foundry and other apartment buildings offering shelter and business use, the dream of a new, more inclusive Northside neighborhood is coming to life.
